Contracting Section 110 Projects

Deadline for CRM Contractors to Submit Expression of Interest

The deadline for CRM contractors to submit an expression of interest is **October 15, 2024**, two weeks from the date the FY24 cooperative agreement cycle projects are posted.

Information Required from CRM Contractors to Submit an Expression of Interest

CRM contractors with suitable expertise and experience are invited to submit an expression of interest in up to three (3) projects, along with their qualifications to conduct a specific Section 110 project(s). These contractors may be considered for additional FY24 projects beyond those listed.

*one resume per project; up to one, single-sided page; include name, title, telephone, email

4. Qualifications

A. If you have already submitted qualifications, note the date sent

B. If you have not yet submitted qualifications, the following information is required:

- i. 10-page maximum submission (letter of interest, cover page, table of contents, and/or appendices are optional and, if incorporated, must be included within the 10-page submission)
- ii. Contact information: name, title, contracting organization's name, telephone, email
- iii. Statement of contracting organization's professional capabilities
- iv. List of previous Section 110-type work projects for DoD or other organizations
- v. Geographic area(s) of contractor's expertise
- 5. Additional qualifications information pertinent to a specific project, if not already included in previously submitted materials (maximum 2 pages per project)
